

The children walked to the schoolhouse. Sometimes they walked a mile or even farther. They walked on cold and snowy days too.

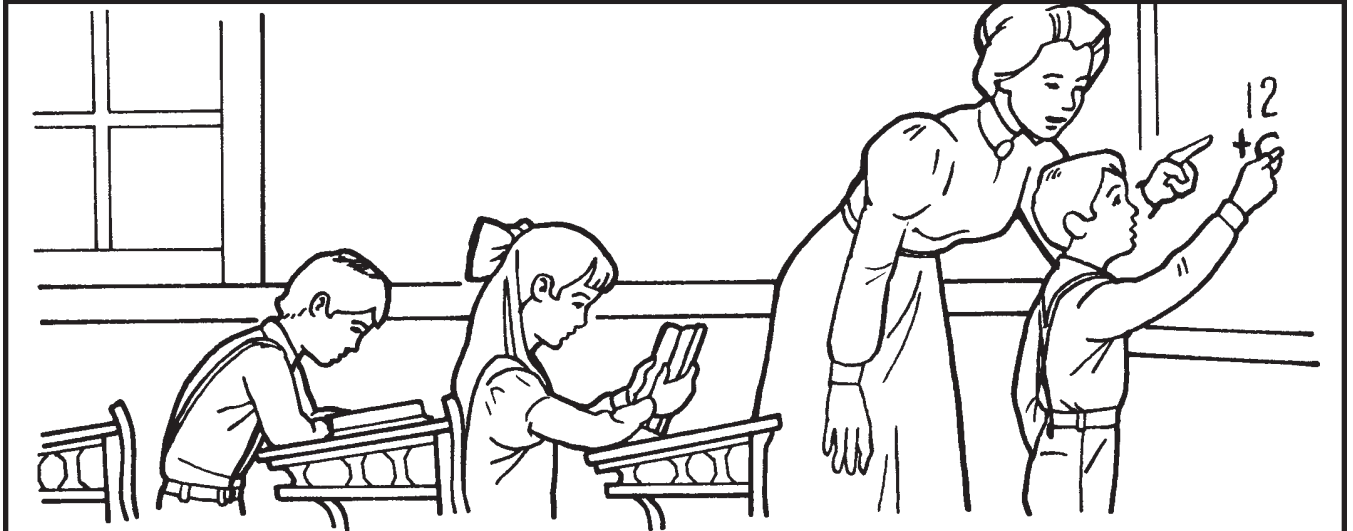

There was one teacher in a one-room school. The teacher swept the school, started the wood stove to heat the school, and taught every subject for all grades.

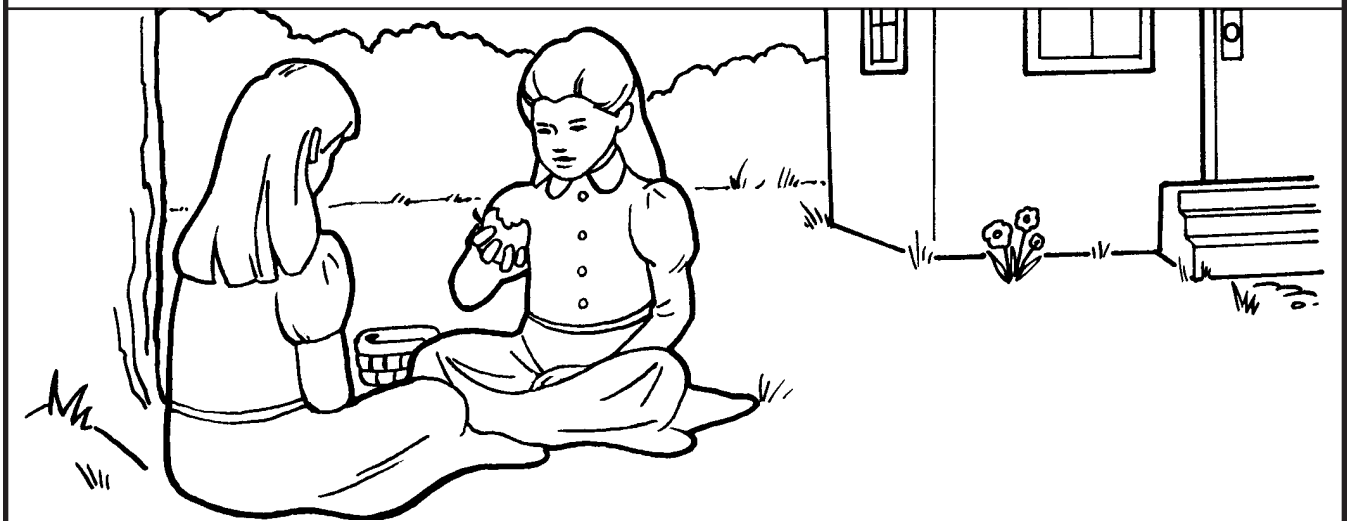
